Action plan: How do we get there?

1 Place

Our community exists within a defined place – the parish of Pucklechurch, including Shortwood, Parkfield and Lyde Green. Within this area, there are places that have an impact on community spirit. Much of what was captured in the survey results identifies people's views on these places – the buildings and facilities within the community that provide spaces for people to interact with other members of the community. For these reasons, our action plan addresses issues of place. The appendix to this action plan lists many of the venues in which people meet within the Community Plan Area.

There are many opportunities and places for people in the community to meet. Reasons for meeting are many and various. Some of the places where people come together are designed for that purpose, such as the community centre in Pucklechurch, the scout hut, the pubs and social clubs and the church and other places of worship. Other venues happen to be meeting places, such as the doctor's surgery, bus stops, shops and the Post Office. The results of the survey identify the improvements respondents feel strongly about.

The following plan sets down a set of actions to meet a defined aim arising from the findings of the Community Plan Steering Group. During the implementation phase of the plan actual tasks and time frames may differ.
