# Pucklechurch Parish Council

Hopefully by the time you read this Winter will have turned and we will all be able to look forward the weather getting brighter and warmer! Council continues to meet twice per month, once in person and once online. The latter is an advisory business meeting at which we are not able to make decisions as a Council as the law currently precludes this – both are public meetings in that residents and others are welcome to attend. All meeting details can be found on our website, with agendas published the week before.

### Parish Council Community Grants - an update

The application window for our community grant scheme closed on 27 January 2023. As expected, the amount requested by community groups collectively exceeded the amount available, especially since we had a bumper number of applicants. Decisions on grant awards will have been taken at the Council meeting scheduled for the 15th February, so all those that have been successful will have been notified by the time this edition of Pucklechurch News lands on your doormat. Details of the awards will be published on our website.

#### **Budget**

Parish Council funds most of its services with funding collected by South Gloucestershire Council via the Council Tax process. Council agrees the amount of money it requires, known as the Precept, from Council Tax payers in our area and the amount appropriate to your tax band is shown on your bill. Our agreed budget is published on the website under the 'Your Council' tab (Accounts). The Precept calculations for 2023/24 are as follows:

### Local electio 1s May 2023 & Voter Identification

South Glouces tershire Town and Parish Council elections will be held on 4 Nay 2023 as will elections for South Gloucestershire Council. Find out more about how to stand for election here: https://beta.southglos.gov.uk/stand-for-election The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023. A wide variety of types of photo

ID will be accepted - for more information on which are acceptable, visit www.electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280. If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk. Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to the electoral services team at South Gloucestershire Council. You can also apply in person at South Gloucestershire Council. Call 01454 863030 to make an appointment to go to the Badminton Road offices where they we can take your photograph and submit your application online for you. Appointments will be available during normal office hours. When applying for a Voter Authority Certificate, you will need to provide the following information:

#### name, address, date of birth

### National Insurance number, a recent photograph

You should apply using the same namethat you used to register to vote.

You can still apply if you do not have or know your National Insurance number. You will need to provide other forms of proof of identity, such as a birth certificate, bank statement and a utility bill.
