Our neighbourhood plan seeks to shape, direct and help to deliver sustainable development by influencing the planning policies and decisions made by South Gloucestershire Council. The plan has been prepared by a Steering group of Parish councillors and Pucklechurch Parish residents and has had input from members of the public and local businesses. We want your views on the draft policies in the plan so that we know that we are submitting our final proposal to South Gloucestershire council in line with our community's expectations. The next stage of the South Gloucestershire Local Plan was voted through on 12th February '25 and will now ask for your views on a significant release of Greenbelt, which would see 1000s of new homes coming to this community and the local area. South Gloucestershire Council Boyd Valley Ward

South Gloucestershire Council's Cabinet has agreed that the updated Local Plan should go to Full Council for approval on 12th February. This detailed document is available on the South Gloucestershire Council website and covers far more than just the sites chosen to accommodate the housing targets to 2041 of 20,423 home plus an 11% buffer. This is a huge increase in homes from the current 118,000. Despite increasing the number of brown field sites selected, this enormous challenge to allocate deliverable sites means regrettably the plan includes sites in the Green Belt but South Gloucestershire Council believes housing will be delivered in the most sustainable locations where schools, health and transport issues can best be addressed.

If the plan is not published by 12th March, there may be a further requirement for 5000 additional houses. It is also very important that the Local Plan is adopted to prevent speculative applications by developers and 'planning by appeal' across South Gloucestershire.

The sites are largely adjacent to the A4174 Ring Road and in Pucklechurch parish this will affect Shortwood, with a large-scale Carsons Green and Rockhouse Farm New Neighbourhoods which also includes 50 homes on Shortwood Hill post 2041 – full details and the masterplan are detailed in the local plan. In addition, Pucklechurch village is being asked to take 60 houses on a site adjacent to Abson Road (between Lower Hodden Lane and Hodden Lane).

From 28th February there will be a further statutory 6-week public consultation with a prescribed format for comments. Comments made at this stage go to the Planning Inspectorate who will determine the issues that need further discussion at the Examination in Public stage to determine if the plan is "sound".

Editor's note: For information much of the new Carsons Green Neighbourhood is in the adjacent parish of Siston. There are other developments within Pucklechurch parish in the Local Plan including the North Lyde 'ecotech' Village (Pucklechurch and Westerleigh & Coalpit Heath parishes) and there are both new and intensified sites to accommodate Gypsy and Travellers and Travelling Showpeople across the parish.

Residents in part of Pucklechurch will benefit from an extended bus service from April as WESTlocal 532 bus serves Oaktree Avenue in the village for the first time. It could be followed by more changes as the people behind the community-led service call for views on a proposal to serve the retail centre in Longwell Green.

The WESTlocal 532 service launched in September 2024 and runs from Emersons Green to Keynsham, via Pucklechurch, Oldland, Warmley and Bitton during the day, with journeys extending to Yate at each end of the day. It's one of a number of WESTlocal services created thanks to funding by the West of England Mayoral Combined Authority led by Mayor Dan Norris.

Cllr Rick Dunning of Pucklechurch Parish Council said "We really value feedback and suggestions. Our current customers have told us they love the service with great comments about the punctuality and the drivers' friendliness. We've had a steady start, but we do need more people to use the service. Changes to the route may help, and we're really keen to hear what people think of extending the route to Longwell Green."

People can have their say by completing a simple online survey at oldlandparishcouncil.gov.uk/westlocal-532-survey A more comprehensive consultation will be launched shortly to enable those not online to participate and give feedback. Changes will need to be considered by the West of England Mayoral Combined Authority and Eurocoaches but could happen from September 2025.

The Adventures of a Village Agent

It has been a busy couple of months for me as Village Agent for the Boyd Valley!

Lots of referrals from enquiries about local cleaners, helping families find carers to help loved ones stay at home, signposting people to the correct support groups and organisations in regard to health, finances, digital inclusion as well as organising Free home fire safety checks with Avon Fire & Rescue.

Transport is always a big issue in the rural areas of South Gloucestershire, but I have been able to signpost many people to transport services for hospital appointments etc. I am in the early stages of aiming to find a solution to the ongoing problem of transport to local lunch clubs and groups in neighbouring villages. Finding a solution to the transport problem will make a huge difference enabling many to engage in social activities that they would otherwise struggle to attend.

After the success in helping to launch the very popular 'Knit and Natter' group, held in Marshfield Community Centre every Tuesday, 1.30-3pm, I have now ventured into Pucklechurch to start the ball rolling to open a new community drop in at the Community Centre, to be heldthe first Monday of each month, 1.30-3pm. We will have visits from Avon Fire & Rescue, our local Policing team, Age UK and many other organisations, and of course there will be plenty of tea and cake!

It was a pleasure to visit the Doynton community Café, held every Wednesday, 10.30-12pm, in Doynton Village Hall. It is fantastic to see so many people enjoy this space regularly and receive such a warm welcome from the volunteers that make it happen, becoming an important group for those who attend.

I have also been able to signpost and issue E-Vouchers for foodbank vouchers with The Trussell Trust. While this can be daunting issue to reach out for help for, there is never any judgement, just endless help and support to everyone that walks through the door.

It is great to be receiving an increase in referrals from Professionals such as Social Workers, Sirona and the local GP surgeries, but it is also great to see the amount or people that self-refer themselves to this service, showing the service has embedded well into the communities that I cover. The Village Agent service is proving very beneficial, and it is exciting to engage with lots of people from different parishes. I am looking forward to continuing to attend The Three Shires Surgery in Wick, last Friday of each month, where I will be available to chat in the waiting room, offering help and advice with the ability to signpost onto organisations and support groups that may help. The first visit was held on Friday 31st January from 10.00-12.00 midday. This is something I hope to offer in all the surgeries in time.

At our March café on Thursday 6th, some gentle fitness activity has been planned. For the April cafe we will celebrate Easter and Spring with music and dance planned for summer cafes. The May cafe will take place one week later than usual, on the second Thursday.

The agenda will include a review of the cafe over the past year and also look forward to helping our local communities to become more dementia aware/friendly in the coming year. News From Three Shires Medical Practice

General Practices continue to face a major funding crisis. Although we were slightly more optimistic, Rural Practices like ours are particularly affected. The rise in National Insurance contributions is problematic as staff wages make up 60% of the Practice budget. The practice is continuing to support the British Medical Association's collective action advice of 25 patient consultations for each doctor each day and we are doing our very best to keep our services going on all four of our surgery sites

Now some good News!! Our flu and COVID vaccination campaign went really well this year; we are very grateful for all the volunteer help at Pucklechurch and Marshfield.

We have a new and very experienced mental health nurse, Gemma North, funded by the local Primary Care Network. She is making a significant contribution to support for people living with mental health issues and is having a very helpful impact on the number of people needing appointments with a doctor.

Our Patient Participation Group (PPG) of patient volunteers continues to support and challenge us and raise issues affecting patients with MP's and councillors. The Friends of Three Shires continue with fundraising and have raised nearly £10,000 for essential equipment needed to run our services efficiently and effectively. This includes two refrigerators, two ECG machines, two adjustable examination couches, four emergency medical packs and three oximeters. A VERY BIG THANK YOU to everyone who has supported the Friends efforts.
