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Annual Meeting of the Parish: thank you

The Annual Meeting of the Parish is open to all electors and must be held once a year between the 1 March and 1 June. This is not however a Parish Council meeting and is provided as an opportunity for parishioners to discuss any matters related to the parish, to meet councillors and to exchange views and comments. This year the meeting was organised to take place at Eagle Crescent on Saturday 2nd April because it enabled residents to view and comment on the exciting designs that had been drawn up for a more inclusive and upgraded play area there. Thankfully the rain stayed away, and we were joined by several residents who were able to view colourful plans and large-scale images produced by HAGS (the Council's preferred contractor). Residents were encouraged to ask questions and to make comments about the design and these were recorded and then discussed at the next Full Council meeting (see more below). Other subjects that were raised included concerns about trees that had become a 'nuisance' due to their size and position, as Could you be a voice for the people of Pucklechurch? Perhaps extended to everyone who came along and who made this such a worthwhile departure from what has been arranged

Eagle Crescent Play Area: contract awarded

Council considered the public response to the Eagle Crescent play area proposals at its Full Council meeting which took place on April 22nd and unanimously agreed, subject to references, to appoint HAGS as the contractor to deliver the play area upgrade. HAGS has been manufacturing and installing outdoor play and sports & fitness equipment for over 70 years and Council was impressed with how well the designs had met the brief with regard to inclusivity as well as value for money.

Planning Applications: PPC responses

The Local Planning Authority for Pucklechurch Parish is South Gloucestershire Council. It is the Planning Authority that makes decisions whether or not to approve/refuse applications and they do this by testing proposals against published policy. Parish Council is a statutory consultee for planning applications and responds to all that are submitted for developments within the parish boundary, as well as any submitted near or adjacent to it that could have an impact on our community.

To say that the planning system is complex would be an understatement, but an important consideration is that the system is there to enable the process of development, not to stop it. It is not enough to say that an application should be refused because you don't want or like it, or because of the number of people that object - success or failure depends on how what is proposed does or does not meet local plan requirements and detailed policy. Parish Council discusses proposals at Full Council meetings and assesses each application on its own merit: it considers a variety of published planning policy documents as well as local knowledge in these matters. A list of the applications to be discussed at any given meeting is published as an itemised list on the meeting agenda. Residents may make their views known to the Parish Council with regard to these applications under the terms of public participation: they may also make comments directly to SGC via its website. In the interest of transparency, and so that residents can see the comments submitted by Council as soon as possible, we have decided to publish these in full as items on the NEWS tab on the Parish Council website, as well as incorporating them within meeting minutes - this makes them much easier to find and read.

Parish Council: resignations, co-options and vacancies

I am pleased to report that Council has recently co-opted Jon Bailey to become a Councillor to join its ranks, but sadly that Caroline Phillips has now also decided to stand down. Caroline had been a Councillor since 2017, and as a Shortwood resident did a sterling job in representing views from beyond the village centre, and in doing so has played a vital role in reminding us that we act as a Council on behalf of the whole parish – thank you Caroline. This means that we have two vacancies on Council. A notice regarding the casual vacancy that has occurred as the result of Caroline's departure has been placed on our website - this is a legal requirement since an election will be held to fill this vacancy if a request for an election is given to the Returning Officer at South Gloucestershire Council by ten electors for our area no later than 10th June 2022, If no request for an election is given, the Parish Council is empowered to fill the vacancy by co-option.

Pucklechurch Cricket Club receives lifesaving defibrillator from local housebuilder

Pucklechurch Cricket Club, has received a life-saving defibrillator from local housebuilder Redrow South West.

Pucklechurch Cricket Club currently has three adult teams, an All Stars Cricket team for 5 to 8-year-olds and a Dynamo Cricket team for 9 to 11-year-olds. In addition to this there is also a recently established ladies softball team.

Ryan Watts, 1st XI Captain at the cricket club, was present at the defibrillator demonstration. He said: "As a captain you always feel responsible for your teams. A defibrillator is an essential tool to save the life of someone in the event of them suffering a cardiac arrest. It is very reassuring to be prepared should any such accident occur at the cricket club in the future.

Members of the cricket club will be able to easily access the defibrillator by the changing room.

The defibrillator gives voice prompts and easy to understand visuals that guide the user through treating a patient who is suffering a cardiac arrest.

Clive Setter from Heartsafe AED locator who supplied the equipment and provided training for the club said: "This is one of the most highly developed defibrillators on the market.

"We are fortunate to have an incredible ambulance service in this country and calling 999 should always be the first call of action in any emergency. However, without a defibrillator there is only about a three or four per cent chance of survival for someone with cardiac arrest. A defibrillator, good CPR and getting to the patient within seven or eight minutes, can increase the success rate by 50 to 70 per cent."

Charlotte Newnes, Area Sales Manager in the South West was also present at the demonstration. She said: "The training experience has been incredibly thoughtprovoking. It has shown me just how important it is that clubs and locations where people gather have access to a defibrillator.

"Here at Redrow we want to contribute to a safe and healthy community - not just at our developments but also in the surrounding areas. We are thrilled to be able to provide this valuable, potentially life-saving resource to Pucklechurch Cricket Club."
