Be Kind - a wish for Pucklechurch 2022

As 2021 begins to draw to a close and elements of our lives are beginning to have some nod towards normality, I thought it might be appropriate to reflect upon and thank all the people in our community that have continued to help make Pucklechurch a great place to live, work and play. It's easy to get drawn into shouting about the things we don't like but we should all take time to think about the things we can really appreciate too. I am particularly aware of, and grateful for, all the charitable and community work our residents get involved with, much of which goes under the radar. If ever there was a time that we need to be kinder to one another and ourselves it is now. Several organisations up and down the country have been running 'kindness' campaigns - in fact one organisation found that 63% of UK adults agree that when people are kind it has a positive impact on their mental health (https://www.mentalhealth.org.uk/campaigns/ kindness/kindness-matters-guide). There have been many acts of kindness which have helped Pucklechurch to be a happier place for people and especially during the pandemic – let's make 2022 an even kinder and happier year too.

Eagle Crescent Play Area

One of the planning conditions attached to the development of new builds at The Moorings and Cable Close required the developer to make funds available for 'off-site provision and/or enhancement of provisions for children and young people' in an area relatively close to the site. This formed part of something called a 's106 agreement' and in this respect the purpose of one element of the funding was to enhance the overall play experience at Eagle Crescent and bring new life to this playground for the benefit of the community. Parish Council has applied to access these s106 funds to enable these improvements, just as it did earlier this year with regard to money that was available to improve our allotments. As well as applying to access the funds, a detailed project management plan has been produced, as well as tender documentation.

The objectives of this project are:

• To provide a more appealing play area for youngsters to have fun, meet friends and play and be happy in their local neighbourhood.

- To make the play area more inclusive.
- To attract new participants and widen participation.
- To provide a more appealing social space to

help grow a sense of community spirit and address loneliness and isolation.

Council is aware that the play area sits within a residential area, and so the project recognises that the site is not suitable for louder activities such as skateboarding, campfires or den building or those where youngsters can congregate unsupervised. New provision is being targeted for the under 9s for daytime use where play can be supervised, and people can socialise and meet others with children. The existing play equipment will be incorporated within a redesigned and refreshed playground, but none of what is being proposed will be delivered without a programme of community engagement that will help inform the final decision-making process undertaken by the Council. If all goes to plan and our application for the funding is successful, work will be completed by October 2022.

Website & Community News

A major undertaking for the Council was realised earlier this year when it launched its brand-new website at www.pucklechurchparishcouncil.gov.uk. The website provides not only the most up to date information about the work of the council but also links to other useful community resources and electronic copies of Pucklechurch News. There is also a dedicated NEWS tab where we endeavour to publish news items relating to, for example, road closures, consultations, and events and wherever possible we also highlight these via our Facebook page too. The range of items we publish is really varied and I would recommend regularly logging on to see what's new.
