Precept

The Council has resolved that there will be no increase in the precept. This has been made possible because we have made savings over this year which resulted from the Clerk's maternity leave and the consequent decrease in its capacity to deliver projects that were budgeted for.

Clerk Update:

My thanks to all Councillors who have given up their time to cover different aspects of the role and for the patience of parishioners whilst we have been understaffed.

M4J18A Update

By the time you read this it is possible that the report regarding options for M4J18a will have been presented and discussed at a South Gloucestershire Council Cabinet meeting. Dog Fouling

The Council has been working with South Gloucestershire Dog Wardens to deal with this problem and with some success. The Wardens' regular visits and discussions with dog owners seem to have slightly reduced the issue. It is important that this initiative is continued so the Council is urging residents to inform it or the Dog Warden of evidence of fouling that is not picked up with names of dog-owners if possible. Failing that even just a description of the dog will help us to identify owners who fail to bag it and bin it.

We also helped put up and take down the Christmas decorations at the Homefield Centre which was a great way to meet up, have some festive fun and a mince pie or two! We have helped someone to fix issues with a mobile phone and laptop, and put together an exercise machine.

With the winter months coming to an end and spring being around the corner, please remember that we are here to help vulnerable people with household tasks such as putting bins out, changing light bulbs or sitting with someone and having a chat. It can be harder for less mobile people to get out in inclement weather, so please give us a ring or send us an email if you think we can help. All our volunteers are police checked and we have public liability insurance.

We've also had new volunteers join us. If you would like to join us too please get in touch. We always welcome more people. You can give as little or as much time as you like, you get to meet new people and everything is local. Every so often, we meet to discuss the scheme so there is a social aspect to what we do as well. Pucklechurch Parish Neighbourhood Plan Whats Next?

The Pucklechurch Parish Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has reviewed the priorities identified in our initial survey. We are now working on a more detailed survey to gather your views on specific policies that would guide development within our parish. Development is always controversial, but we can help shape the future of our neighbourhoods by creating a neighbourhood plan. The parish council has hired a consultant to aid us in the next phase of neighbourhood plan development. Lemon Gazelle, a small, local firm, has helped a number of other localities engage the community and build a solid foundation of public opinion to support neighbourhood plans.

With Lemon Gazelle's help, we will be running a public session soon to discuss potential planning policies for our area. Look out for notices about when and where, and keep an eye out for our next survey as well.

New Local Plan Consultation

South Gloucestershire Council has published a draft of its new Local Plan, which identifies additional homes, businesses, transport, and other infrastructure needed to support the anticipated growth from 2018 to 2036. This plan will define the new housing parameters for our neighbourhood plan.

Hats off to Lyn Ford! Lyn's done a sterling job for over 25 years providing a challenging, friendly, exciting programme for hundreds of Brownies in our village. But now she has decided her family must take priority and so she will be

stepping down as leader at the end of this school year in July. Her daughter, Phil, now has another baby so she is also unable to continue.

However, I have no doubt we have many capable ladies who can step in and run a very successful Brownie Unit. All you need is to:-

Be aged 18+ and have a sense of fun! Enjoy working with girls aged 7-10.

Join together with one or two more interested adults, to form a small team, to run the Unit together (many hands make light work and it's more fun and easier in a team). Do it your own way – Lyn doesn't want people to think they have to continue in her footsteps.

You will receive training and a dedicated mentor. Meanwhile the Brownies have been busy as usual. They have explored the science behind the power of wind. Here's how. Thread a drinking straw onto a length of string and tie taut between two chairs. Blow up a balloon but don't seal the end. Sellotape onto the straw and let go. Watch it whizz along the string. They've made Chinese fortune tellers and Lyn tells me she was so pleased to see the girls had written friendly, positive sentences inside. They are beginning their Road Safety badge too, using a specially produced booklet and activities too.



Although small in number at present this hasn't stopped the Guides working on specific badges. One patrol made their own face packs which they applied liberally on their faces! Glamorama is the name of this badge. Whilst this was taking place the second patrol were busy in the kitchen making hot dogs, one of the clauses in the Party badge. They learned how to chop and cook onions successfully and to check whether the sausages were hot enough. Next is Project Camp Blanket, and learning to sew - a very useful skill which should be well practised by the time some of them have sewn on a large number of badges. They will celebrate our international Thinking Day in the Unit and are planning a Unit summer camp.
