Three Shires Patient Participation Group (PPG) held its first Annual General Meeting in March. Covering the four surgery sites of the Practice, the principal aim of the PPG is to bring forward ideas and suggestions from patients for the benefit of the Practice and its patients.

Sixteen patients from Colerne, Marshfield, Pucklechurch and Wick, are now members of the PPG. Last Autumn we attended 28 of the Practice flu clinics giving out leaflets and survey forms including information for carers. Carers' information packs are now available at every surgery for people looking after a relative, friend or neighbour.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our patient survey. 119 patients responded and the results of the survey will be published on the Practice website. As a result of the survey responses, we'll be looking at befriending, recruiting volunteers, encouraging more use of the Practice website (www. threeshiresmedical.co.uk), developing the existing online Patient Reference Group and falls prevention. We are also taking account of the comments that respondents made, with a view to helping the Practice to address these issues.

As a first step in setting up a telephone befriending scheme and some form of support between people with similar illnesses or other health problems, we will be compiling lists of interested people throughout the practice. The telephone befriending scheme could evolve into a visiting or Good Neighbour scheme in time. Good Neighbour schemes involve volunteers helping people who are isolated or have problems with daily tasks, and this can include help for someone just home from hospital, befriending, practical help in the house, trips to the surgery, hospital transport or help with shopping or going out. The list of people interested in support groups or an online forum could begin with people with the same illness or health problem being put in touch with each other.
